"REPEALING HEALTH RULES, 1892."

[L.S.] HUGH NELSON.

THEODORE DAVIE, *Attorney-General*, WHEREAS the epidemic of small-pox recently prevailing has been brought under effective control, and there appears to be no longer any necessity for the continuance in office of the Provincial Health Officer appointed under Order in Council bearing date the 9th of July, 1892, or for the further exercise and performance by him of the powers and duties conferred on and assigned to the Provincial Health Officer by the "Provincial Health Rules, 1892," and the "Supplementary Provincial Health Regulations, 1892":

Therefore, His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor has, by and with the advice of His Executive Council, been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The said Order in Council is hereby repealed, and the therein mentioned John Chapman Davie, and the officer appointed by him under section 2 of the said Regulations, are, and each of them is, hereby relieved and discharged from the further exercise of any and all powers on them or either of them conferred, and from the further performance of any and all duties to them or either of them assigned, under and by virtue of the said Rules and Regulations, or any of them, and the powers and duties of the Provincial Health Officer under the said Rules and Regulations shall devolve upon and be performable by the Municipal Health Officer in each of the Cities of Victoria, Vancouver, New Westminster, and Nanaimo, and in other cases by the Local Boards of Health in and for their several Districts, and the powers and duties of the officer appointed under section 2 of the said Regulations shall henceforth devolve upon and be performable by the Municipal Health Officer for the City of Victoria.

2. Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, and 9 of the "Supplementary Provincial Health Regulations, 1892," are hereby repealed.

3. No order, act, or thing hitherto made, done, or transacted in anywise howsoever under or by virtue of the said Rules or Regulations, or any of them, shall in any way whatever be invalidated, avoided, or made ineffectual by reason only of any repeal contained in these Rules.

4. These Rules may be cited as the "Repealing Health Rules, 1892."
